## *“A Brief History of Landscape Architecture in St. Louis”*

Although St. Louis largely grew up without a plan, over two centuries many outstanding landscape designers have worked here, laying out neighborhoods, parks, institutions and individual properties.

This talk is intended to draw attention to this little-known part of our heritage.

Esley Hamilton has been preservation historian for the St. Louis County Department of Parks and Recreation since 1977. He taught historic preservation and the history of landscape architecture at Washington University's School of Architecture for twenty years. He holds the honorary degree of doctor of arts and letters, awarded by the University of Missouri St. Louis in 2009. His book, *St. Louis Parks*, co-authored with NiNi Harris, appeared in 2012. Currently he is continuing part-time with County Parks. He serves on the boards of the Carondelet Historical Society, the Sappington-Concord Historical Society, the Sutter-Meyer House in University City, and the St. Louis Chapter of the Society of Architectural Historians, as well as the board of Les Amis.
