The house was built in 1851 by John Hall. Hall sold it to Cornelia Hempsten Wilson in 1853 and she lived in the house for only one year. Robert Campbell purchased the house in 1854, and he and his family lived there until the death of his last surviving child in 1938. Then the building was located at 20 Lucas Place.

The MAC present building replaced an older MAC which burned in 1913 with serious loss of life. Boatman's Bank was also in the building. William Ittner designed the new MAC which is located at the northwest corner of Fourth and Washington today. This building has not had apparent modifications other than additions in 1927 and 1950. This building has round bays on the ground floor, a deep overhanging cornice and brackets, and lozenge windows. The lower two floors are in stone, and the middle three are in the running bricks on the upper four floors, the brick is a unique diamond pattern. The MAC became a prominent city landmark in 1976.
